The G-20 (Group of Twenty) is an international forum of the world's largest advanced and emerging economies, representing around 80% of the world's GDP and two-thirds of its population. The G-20 meets annually to discuss global economic and financial issues, as well as to promote international cooperation and coordination on a range of issues, including climate change, trade, and development.

The G-20 back-to-back drawing was organized by GSMS-GTU as a part of a fun event for the participating students. It covered a wide range of themes such as clean energy, digital transformation, industry 4.0, potable water for all, etc. In total, 30 teams consisting of 2 members participated in the activity wherein one member was made to stand facing the wall with a blank paper and the other member was made to stand exactly behind the first one with a printed paper. The latter was asked to trace the drawing based on which the former was asked to identify and draw in the blank paper. The activity was carried out in multiple rounds with eliminations in each round and one team was declared as a winner in the end. The objective was to evaluate the team trust, focus, and coordination amongst the teammates.
