- Indecent Behaviour
- Criminal Intimidation/wrongful Restraint
- Undermining Human Dignity
- Financial Exploitation/extortion
- Use Of Force

A STUDENT INDULGING IN RAGGING CAN BE:

- Cancellation of admission.
- Suspension from attending classes.
- Withholding/withdrawing Scholarships/Fellowship and other benefits.
- Deterring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Deterring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament or youth festival etc.
- Collective punishment when the persons concealing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on potential raggers.


