4. Description of the Event:

On 22 nd December, 2023, GSMS GTU organized an enlightening industrial visit to BSE GIFT City in Gandhinagar. Accompanied by esteemed faculty members, Ms. Medha Vyas, Mr. Rajan Modha, and Ms. Bhagyashri, the visit aimed to provide students with practical insights into the workings of the stock exchange.

The BSE staff warmly welcomed us and guided us through the presentation room. The session commenced with a historical overview, highlighting BSE's establishment in 1875 as a native share and stock exchange, initially focusing on cotton trading.

Post-Independence, the financial needs of the growing Indian economy prompted the shift towards equity markets. In 1922, SEBI was established as a regulatory organization to ensure market integrity. In 1995, BSE and NSE developed the online platforms and all the other regional exchange register under this both exchanges. This online platform provides transparency to the investors. The electronic method to record the transaction NSDL and CDSL are used. Even though online platforms are there, the transactions were happening between two members. To resolve this issue they developed the system where transaction will happen between two investors.

The speaker gave us a overview on saving and investment they emphasize on the power of investment with real life example of Warren Buffett. Importance of investment to create wealth and to beat increasing inflation. Also gave us information about various investment instruments such as equity, debt instruments, debentures, equity derivatives, currency derivatives, government securities, mutual funds, and ETFs. Notably, the faculty inquired about ETFs. By digging deep in the EFT, he mentioned that EFT invest the funds on behalf of the investors. They gave us detailed information about this various instruments of investment.

In earlier there was 30 days of trading cycle and settlement were happening at the end of the month. This cycle provides very slow reinvestment into the market. With the development of services T+2 day cycle were use. Recently it has been changed from T+2 to T+1 day settlement, as Bank clearing facility improvise. If seller has not fulfil his obligation that transaction will settle with auction. The previous day closing price will be the base price.

The presentation introduced different capitalization groups like A, B, T, F, S, G, X, M, and Z. The Exchange identify each company and according to their characteristic the company classify them into this groups. The discussion expanded to shareholding patterns, upper and lower circuits, pledged and re- pledged shares, and the new margin collection system. The discussion delved into the changes in IPO processes, allowing applications through UPI and ASBA. Utilizing the terminal to showcase real-time price changes.

The session concluded with a strong emphasis on security measures, cautioning against signing documents without thorough reading, safeguarding ID proofs, and staying vigilant against fraud. A question-answer session followed, accompanied by refreshments, enhancing the overall experience.
