**Description** : The primary goal of the **State Level Summer Internship Project (SIP) Competition – “Anusandhan 2025”** was to provide a dynamic platform for management students to showcase their research-based learning and practical insights gained during their summer internships. The event aimed to encourage analytical thinking, professional presentation, and industry-oriented problem-solving among future managers. The competition was graced by esteemed judges and guests including Mr. Chintan Patel, Mr. Darshan Gohil, Mr. Hardik Thakkar, Dr. Shweta Bambuwala, Dr. Chhaya Patel, and Dr. Bhavesh Parmar, who evaluated the students across different tracks and provided valuable feedback on their projects. The GTU-School of Management Studies (GSMS), successfully organized its prestigious State-Level Summer Internship Project (SIP) Competition, titled “Anusandhan – 2025,” on 10<sup>th</sup> October 2025 at Shri Acharya Chanakya Seminar Hall, GTU campus, Chandkheda, Ahmedabad. The event aimed to provide a professional platform for management students from across the state to present their internship-based research projects and showcase their analytical thinking, industry insights, and presentation skills. “Anusandhan” is one of the most awaited flagship events at GSMS, known for encouraging experiential learning and fostering research-oriented thinking among students pursuing management education.

The event began with an auspicious lamp-lighting ceremony, symbolizing the spirit of knowledge and enlightenment, followed by GTU Song, which filled the hall with enthusiasm and pride. The dignitaries present for the inaugural ceremony included Mr. Chintan Patel, Mr. Darshan Gohil, Mr. Hardik Thakkar, Dr. Shweta Bambuwala, Dr. Chhaya Patel, and Dr. Bhavesh Parmar. Their presence added immense value and inspiration to the competition. After the formal inauguration, Dr. Kaushal Bhatt, Associate Professor at GSMS, addressed the gathering and delivered the introductory speech. He welcomed the participants and guests warmly and discussed the importance of research and innovation in management education. He highlighted that participants had come from various cities such as Surat, Vapi, Kutch, and other parts of Gujarat, reflecting the wide reach and recognition of the event. Dr. Bhatt also



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emphasized the significance of such platforms in helping students develop critical thinking and communication skills that are essential in the professional world.

Following the introduction, Dr. Priyanka Bhatt, Event Coordinator, shared an overview of the evaluation process and explained the distribution of marks across different criteria. She elaborated that the total marks were divided based on various aspects such as presentation skills, content clarity, problem identification, analytical approach, industry application, and confidence of delivery. Each participant was given ten minutes for presentation and five minutes for questions and answers. She further informed that exceeding the time limit could lead to negative marking, and the evaluation would be carried out in two rounds. The first round involved all registered participants presenting their Summer Internship Projects before the jury, and based on their performance, the top ten participants would qualify for the final round.

After her briefing, the Track Committee and organizing team efficiently managed the division of participants and judges across different rooms according to their respective tracks. The evaluation process was well-structured and systematically organized. The judges were allocated specific tracks and rooms to ensure smooth conduct of the presentations. Mr. Chintan Patel evaluated the participants in Track 01 held at Chanakya Hall, Mr. Darshan Gohil was assigned Track 02 in the IQAC Room, Mr. Hardik Thakkar judged Track 03 in Room 2, Dr. Shweta Bambuwala handled Track 04 in Room 3, and Dr. Chhaya Patel assessed Track 05 in Room 4. This systematic division ensured that all participants had an equal opportunity to present before expert panels, and that the evaluation process was fair, transparent, and time-efficient.

The judges then proceeded to their allocated rooms, and students began presenting their internship projects. Each presentation demonstrated thoughtful research, practical learning, and individual effort, making the preliminary round a competitive and engaging session. The environment was charged with enthusiasm as participants confidently shared their project



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objectives, research methodologies, findings, and recommendations before the evaluation panel.

Upon the completion of the first round, a short lunch break was organized for all guests, judges, and participants. After lunch, everyone gathered once again at Chanakya Hall for the final round of “Anusandhan 2025.” The hall buzzed with excitement as the Master of Ceremony announced the names of the top ten finalists who made it through to the second round. The finalists were Sarah Onyl Khambhata, Hinal Rasikbhai Savalia, Shreyal Panchal, Vishwa Kariya, Nancy Gajjar, Gracy Jigneshbhai Khatri, Dhaval Prajapati, Urvashi Yadav, Prinal Parimal Nil, and Disha Shah. The finalists once again presented their projects before the distinguished judges, who evaluated them based on the 50-mark criteria focusing on innovation, analytical depth, relevance to industry problems, clarity of communication, and presentation quality.

Before the announcement of results, Mr. Chintan Patel delivered a motivational speech appreciating the efforts of all participants and the organizing team. He drew a thoughtful comparison between the film “*Dangal*” and professional success, emphasizing how the film achieved massive recognition in China because of its strong values and emotional connection. He explained that success, whether in business, academics, or life, comes from understanding the “why” behind our actions. His message encouraged students to work with purpose, self-awareness, and a clear sense of direction in everything they pursue. His speech deeply resonated with the audience and added an inspiring dimension to the event.
