4) **Description of Event (Objective/Rationale to Organize the Event):**

The Indian Youth Parliament 2026 was organized as a national-level simulation and formal conference aimed at engaging young leaders in meaningful deliberations on contemporary issues of national and international importance. GTU School of Management Studies (GSMS) selected and deputed a team of four students to represent Gujarat Technological University at this prestigious event held in Nagpur from 20th to 23rd March 2026.

The event brought together students from universities across India for structured discussions on themes including international relations, Indian knowledge systems, the role of Artificial Intelligence in promoting Indian languages, and the vision of Viksit Bharat 2047. The objective was to nurture informed, responsible, and intellectually grounded young citizens capable of contributing meaningfully to nation-building.

Day 01 – 20 March 2026

Prof. Srinivas Varakhedi – Vice-Chancellor, Central Sanskrit University

Prof. Varakhedi delivered the presidential address, emphasizing the importance of Indian knowledge systems and Sanskrit-based intellectual traditions. He set the tone of the event as a meaningful blend of tradition and modern nation-building.

Shri Mohan Bhagwat – Sarsanchalak, RSS

Shri Bhagwat spoke on Panch Parivartan (five transformations), highlighting cultural rootedness, self-reliance, and social responsibility. He urged the youth to actively contribute towards Viksit Bharat 2047 and interacted directly with the participants, addressing their queries.

Shri Ayanjit Sen

Shri Sen led workshops and review sessions on international relations, geopolitics, and information warfare, encouraging critical thinking and analytical engagement among participants.

Shri C. P. Radhakrishnan – Hon'ble Vice President of India

The Vice President delivered the keynote address, speaking on democratic values, governance, and youth participation in policy and nation-building. He highlighted India's civilizational continuity in democracy.

Shri Jishnu Dev Varma – Hon'ble Governor of Maharashtra

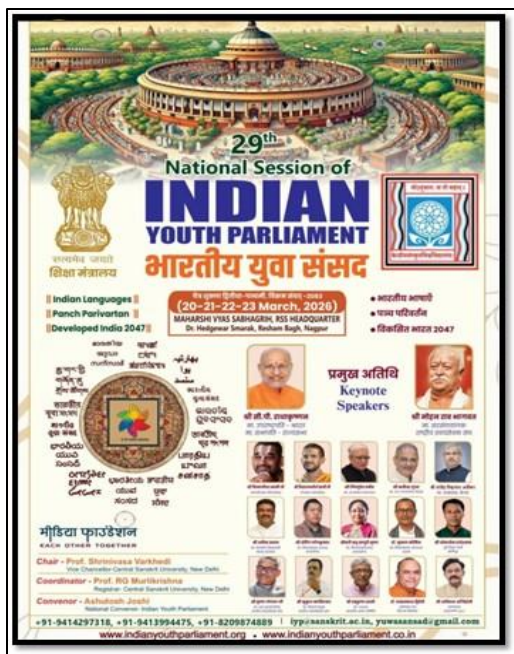

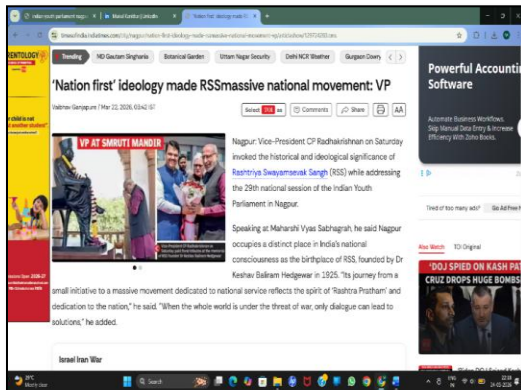
9) Feedback on the Event:
